

## Feature Presentation Jack Nisbet Local Author and Historian **'Reshaping A River'** In the Century between the building of Spokane House in 1810 and the construction of the Little Falls, Long Lake and Nine

and the construction of the Little Falls, Long Lake and Nine Mile Falls dams, the lower Spokane River underwent drastic changes while somehow retaining much of its basic character. This slide presentation will use stories, fur trade journals, maps and period artwork to explore how that river relates to the plane where we live today
